

Manuscript Submission

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The **title page** (separate) should include:

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- A concise and informative title
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Please provide an **abstract** of 100 – 250 words. The abstract should not contain any undefined abbreviations or unspecified references.

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Please provide 4 to 6 **keywords** which can be used for indexing purposes.

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The journal's language is English. British or American English spelling and terminology may be used, but either one should be followed consistently throughout the article. We appreciate any efforts that you make to ensure that the language is corrected before submission. This will greatly improve the legibility of your paper if English or French is not your first language.

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Acknowledgments

Acknowledgments of people, grants, funds, etc. should be placed in a separate section before the reference list. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

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The list of **References** should only include works that are cited in the text and that have been published or accepted for publication. Personal communications and unpublished works should only be mentioned in the text. Do not use footnotes or endnotes as a substitute for a reference list.

Citation in text

Cite references in the text by *name* and *year* in parentheses. Some examples:

- Negotiation research spans many disciplines (Thompson 1990)
- This result was later contradicted (Becker and Seligman 1996)
- This effect has been widely studied (Abbott 1991; Barakat et al. 1995; Kelso and Smith 1998; Medvec et al. 1993)

- Negotiation research spans many disciplines (Thompson 1990a, b)

List style (APA)

Reference list entries should be alphabetized by the last names of the first author of each work.
