

Information for Authors

International Journal of Automation and Computing (IJAC) publishes papers on original theoretical and experimental research and development in automation and computing, targets many special issues on innovative topics and specific subjects, and strives to bridge the gap between theoretical research and practical applications. Topics include but are not limited to artificial intelligence, automatic control, bioinformatics, computer science, information technology, modelling and simulation, networks and communications, optimization and decision, pattern recognition, robotics, signal processing, and systems engineering. Submission of Papers

All manuscripts, pdf. or doc. required, will be submitted online at <http://mc03.manuscriptcentral.com/ijac>.

Conditions of Publication

To avoid duplicate publication, manuscripts submitted to IJAC, except for rejection ones, are not allowed to submit or publish elsewhere in English or any other language. It is the authors, not IJAC, who are responsible for the content.

Submitting a manuscript signifies that it has neither been copyrighted, published, submitted, nor accepted for publication elsewhere. When using their own previously published or submitted material as a basis for a new submission, the authors are required to cite the previous work(s) and very clearly indicate how the new submission differs from the previous one(s).

Types of Contribution

Submitted articles may be of the three basic types:

Review:

Extensive reviews of established or emerging research topics or application areas (more than 10 printed pages).

Research article:

Detailed discussion involving new research, applications or developments (more than 10 printed pages).

Perspectives:

Perspectives (more than 1 page) highlight recent exciting research, but do not primarily discuss the author's own work. The authors may provide context for the findings within a field or explain potential interdisciplinary significance.

Correspondence:

Letters to the Editor about the journal or to authors commenting on previously published papers. In the latter case, the Editor will give the authors an opportunity to respond (at least 3 printed pages).

Manuscript Preparation

General:

Manuscripts must be typed in double-column format. Authors are advised to use our template to prepare your submissions (Download the IJAC Template at <http://www.ijac.net>). The fax number, e-mail address and postal address of the corresponding author, who should easily be identified with an asterisk and footnote, should be given. Full postal addresses of all co-authors must be included.

Text:

Manuscripts should include the following parts (in order): Title, Authors, Affiliations, Abstract, Keywords, Main text, Acknowledgement (if any), Appendices, References and Biographies.

Figures:

All figures must be provided in a camera-ready form, which are suitable for reproduction. Photographs, charts and diagrams are all to be referred to as "Fig(s)." and should be numbered consecutively in the order to which they are referred. They should be included within the text. Every figure must have a caption.

Tables:

Tables should be numbered consecutively with suitable captions.

References:

All publications cited in the text should be presented in the reference list at the end of the manuscript. References must be listed in accord with the order they were cited (numerical order). It is not necessary to mention the author(s) of the reference unless it is relevant to your text. The names of all authors should be given in the references unless the authors are more than six. If there are more than six authors, you may use et al. after the name of the first author. An example for references is given below:

[1] A. Isidori, A remark on the problem of semiglobal nonlinear output regulation, IEEE Transactions on Automatic Control, vol. 42, no. 12, pp. 1734-1738, 1997.

It is suggested to use Reference manager software, Endnote, Reference Manager or other similar software which may help the authors to correct spelling errors or fault information.

Illustrations:

All illustrations must be provided in a camera-ready form, which are suitable for reproduction. Photographs, charts and diagrams are all to be referred to as "Figure(s)" and should be numbered consecutively in the order to which they are referred. They should be included within the text. Every figure must have a caption.

Biographies:

A short biography of every author should be provided in regular papers and brief papers.

Cover letter:

A cover letter must be submitted along with the manuscript, stating that the manuscript has been read and approved in final form by all authors. Authors should ensure that the manuscript has not been submitted for publication elsewhere.

Publication

The corresponding author will receive an email when the manuscript is accepted. Please prepare the final version according to the requirement in this email.

Format:

When a manuscript is accepted for publication, it should be put in the WORD or LaTeX format. Download the IJAC Template at <http://www.ijac.net>.

Language polishing:

The final version will be sent to editors for editing and English language polishing.

Proofs

Proofs are considered to be the final version of the manuscript. The editorial office will deliver electronic proofs to all authors via email, and the proofed version should be returned before the due time. Corrections should be restricted to typesetting errors. Otherwise, the publication process will be delayed because of repetitive check and review. Any queries from editors should be answered in full.

Copyright

All authors must sign the Transfer of Copyright Agreement before the paper is published. This agreement enables the publisher to protect the copyrighted material for the authors, without affecting the authors' proprietary rights. Authors are responsible for obtaining permission from the copyright holder to reproduce any figures or other material included in the paper for which copyright already exists. Research Data Policy

The journal encourages authors, where possible and applicable, to deposit data that support the findings of their research in a public repository. Authors and editors who do not have a preferred repository should consult Springer Nature's list of repositories and research data policy.
