### Manuscript submission

Titles for this series are either solicited by the series editor or proposed by the prospective author using the form available on the website: <https://www.springer.com/series/14642>

### Our peer review policy

In order to maintain our high standard of publication, submissions are subject to peer review to assess the validity, quality and originality of the proposed scholarly material. This means that:

- Initially proposals are reviewed by the series editor in conjunction with the advisory editorial board as required;
- Projects will then be sent for external peer review to an expert (or experts) in the field;
- After the final manuscript has been submitted, it is sent for review to an expert (or experts) in the field;
- If the manuscript is recommended for publication after revision, the revised version may be sent out for another round of review;
- Authors should submit an outline of the changes together with the revised manuscript;
- The final decision to accept or reject the manuscript is made by the series editor in conjunction with the publisher.

Note that peer review is single blind. See Peer Review Guidance document for detailed information on the peer review process.

### Ethical requirements

Authors need to disclose any funding sources and/or conflicts of interest they might have. In addition, authors must also confirm that research/experiments described in the chapters involving humans or animals were conducted in accordance with the corresponding ethical guidelines, and that informed consent was obtained where necessary. Authors should include these statements in a separate section entitled “Compliance with Ethical Standards” after the acknowledgments and before the references section as outlined in the **Book Ethics Policy** on the [series webpage](#). Authors must follow the **Book Ethics Policy**.
